## The correct name for Taiwanese Campanula (Campanulaceae)

**Abstract.** The correct name for the sole species of *Campanula* on Taiwan (previously known as *C. canescens* Wallich ex A. DC., *nom illeg.*, or *C. benthamii* Wallich ex Kitam.) is *C. dimorphantha* Schweinf. In addition to its range in southern and eastern Asia, this species also occurs disjunctly in the Saharo-Arabian Region of northeastern Africa.

**Key words:** Campanula dimorphantha Schweinf.: Campanula canescens Wallich ex A. DC: Flora of Taiwan.

In the Flora of Taiwan, Kao and DeVol (1978) used the name Campanula canescens Wallich ex A. DC. for the sole species of Campanula on the island. In a recent review of the systematics and biogeography of Taiwanese Campanulaceae (Lammers, 1992), it was pointed out that this name was illegitimate, being a later homonym of C. canescens (Waldst. & Kit.) Roth (based on Phyteuma canescens Waldst. & Kit.), which is a homotypic synonym of Asyneuma canescens (Waldst. & Kit.) Griseb & Schenk. Following several other Asian authors, I took up the name C. benthamii Wallich ex Kitam. for this species, believing it to be the next available.

However, I overlooked a paper by Thulin (1987), in which it was shown that there are two other names that represent the same taxon and have priority over *Campanula benthamii*. The earlier of the two is *Cephalostigma spathulatum* Thwaites, based upon plants collected in Sri Lanka. However, the epithet *spathulata* is preoccupied in *Campanula* and cannot be taken up.

The significance of this correction is not only nomenclatural, but also biogeographic. In the recent review of Taiwanese Campanulaceae (Lammers, 1992),

iopia, and the Sudan (Thulin, 1987). These populations lie primarily within the Saharo-Arabian Region of the Tethyan subkingdom (Holarctic Kingdom), as delimited by Takhtajan (1986). *Campanula dimorphantha* is thus significant as the only Taiwanese representative of the family to extend so far west. This broad distribution is comparable in scope to that of *Lobelia angulata* and *Wahlenbergia marginata*. Like them, *Campanula dimorphantha* occupies rather disturbed habitats, such as river banks and irrigation canals (Thulin, 1987).

台灣產桔梗屬(Campanula) 植物僅一種,過去被稱爲 *C. canescens* Wallich ex A. DC. (不合法名),或 *C. benthamii* Wallich ex Kitam.;但其正確之學名應爲 *C. dimorphantha* Schweinf.。此植物除產亞洲南部及東部外,亦斷續分布於東北非撤哈拉—阿拉伯地區。
